We have had a busy last 6 weeks Fiji moved her closer towards the hosting various teams and individuals Lord.

We are now preparing for our Medical Outreach to Lewa and Nadrau villages inland from Tavua and close to Monasavu Dam. The team will really be in the interior! We have 27 people on this outreach including 7 children and some teenagers so this will be the biggest medical outreach group we have sent out.

June saw the arrival of a German girl (Miriam) who has been traveling around the world and met some YWAMers in NZ. She was referred to us by one of our previous directors Beryl Turner. Miriam had a great week with us, staying with Ben and Kaba at Naviago Village and Vijay in Vaivai. We are certain Miriam's stay in

Richard and Thelma's home church sent a small team for ten days and we were able to get them ministering at Ben and Kaba's village and the Vaivai settlement. They were amazed at the hospitality and openness for people to invite them into their homes as they went door to door. Bethlehem Team Leader writes:

“The biggest highlight for me was going to the prison. While we were there I was able to preach the gospel and 5 men (half the room) prayed for salvation. After the men dedicated their lives to Jesus we had a time of

ministry and each person in the room felt the weight of God's presence. For me it was one of the most powerful times of ministry that I have ever been a part of. We were also able to connect with the commissioner of the entire Western Province in Fiji and he invited us to come back at any time and he would allow us to speak to all the staff and all of the prisoners at the prisons in Lautoka and in Ba.

Another highlight for the team was our time spent in Soso. While we were there we prayed for an older couple and their son. After spending time with them and praying for healing all of them were healed and incredibly encouraged. They were able to speak truth over the son and after our time with the family our ministry in the village opened immensely.”
